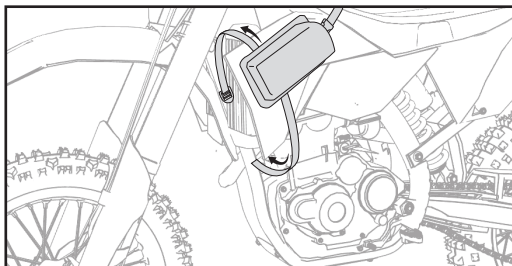
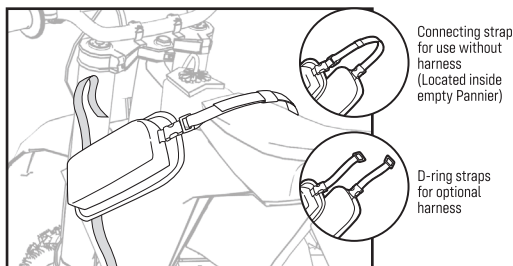


MOUNTING AND INSTALLATION INSTRUCTIONS

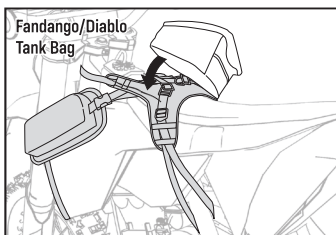
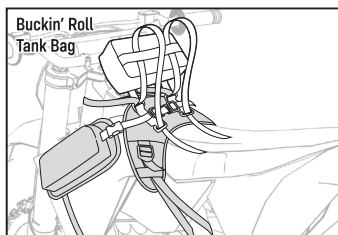


1 Remove webbing and D-ring straps from side-release fasteners on Pockets. Replace with included webbing and side-release buckle strap, connecting Pockets together with zippers facing up. Lay connected Pannier pockets across front of bike. On bikes with steep seat fronts and/or fuel fills, wrap connecting strap around fuel fill neck. On flatter seat/tank designs, remove seat and run connecting strap under front anchor of seat, then replace seat. A secure anchor point is key, so you can draw tension against it, stabilizing Pockets.

2 Secure front Pocket straps around cowl, tank vents, tank or radiator mounts. Tighten straps and secure loose webbing ends. Reinforce and stabilize with Pronghorn Straps (optional), if needed. NOTE: Prevent scuffs and scratches by installing Giant Loop's Vinyl Protective film beneath contact surfaces of Pannier Pockets and straps.

Check to make sure Pockets and straps do not interfere with full swing of handlebars. Do not damage or interfere with any wiring, cables, other controls. Do not allow any part of Pockets or straps to make direct contact with hot engine or exhaust components.

Re-tighten all connections and secure all loose webbing ends. Grip it and rip it!



The two 2-liter Pannier Pockets integrate with the harness of the Buckin' Roll Tank Bag, as well as the Kiger/Fandango/Diablo Tank Bag models.

PACKING TIPS

- Pannier Pockets are Adventure Proof - not waterproof. Pack moisture-sensitive gear in plastic bags or waterproof sleeves to prevent damage.
- Do not overstuff or over-load Pannier Pockets. The challenge should be to pack as little as necessary to be safe, comfortable and self-sufficient. Go light. Go fast. Go far.
- Pack all sharp and/or hard items inside a protective layer. For example, create a sleeve for tire irons from a section of old inner tube, pack tools in rolls and wrap other hard items in clothing.

CARING FOR POSSIBLES POUCH™

- Treat zippers with care and respect. Keep them clean and lubricated with zipper wax or lube. Don't yank or pull - sliiiiide!
- Keep away from hot exhaust.
- Avoid sharp metal edges. Protect webbing with inner tube sleeve to prevent abrasion.
- Secure loose webbing ends when riding. Check and retighten all connections at each stop.
- Avoid exposure to insect repellents containing DEET.
- Hand wash Possibles Pouch with mild soap (like Simple Green), rinse with clean water and air dry. DO NOT MACHINE WASH OR DRY.
- Prevent mold, mildew and funky stench by unpacking wet gear, rinsing thoroughly with fresh water and airing dry.
